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


- ONCAT Research RFP

- Worked with OUAC to secure data regarding transcripts transferred in 2015 and 2016

ABOUT THE DATA

 2015 & 2016 transcript transfer requests, provided by OUAC & OCAS

- Only Non-Direct Applicants included (small variation between OCAS and OUAC definition)
- Unit of Analysis Transcripts transferred





POPULATION GROUPS

- Three population groups were included in the study:
 - All Applicants 252,945 transcripts transferred
 - Indigenous Applicants 5,996 transcripts transferred
 - First Generation Applicants 95,435 transcripts transferred





KEY FINDING AREAS

• Analysis by:

- Institutional Direction/Type Mobility
- Geographic Mobility
- Study Area
- Destination Credential Type applied to





INSTITUTIONAL MOVEMENT

• KEY FINDING:

- For All Applicants 70% of all transcripts transferred were directed to Colleges
- Shifts observed in the First Generation population, with 53% of all transcripts transferred directed to Universities
- Indigenous community shows no clear trend at this point



2015 Number of Transcripts Transferred: by Feeder Institution Type and Destination Institution Type








2016 - INSTITUTIONAL TYPE AND DIRECTION

GEOGRAPHIC MOBILITY

- Institutions were divided across Four Regions:
 - Eastern, Central, Northern, Western
- KEY FINDINGS:
 - Most transcripts were transferred to institutions in the Central Region, representing almost half of all transcripts transferred
 - Generally, applicants stay in the same Region they started in
 - Some variation according to Population Type and Region
 - ONCAT impacts










2015 Movement from each Region INTO the NORTHERN REGION

GEOGRAPHIC MOBILITY – COMMON PATHWAYS

- We did a deep dive into a wide variety of layers:
 - To Which Region -> From Same or Different Region -> From a Same or Different type of Institution
- The most common path varies slightly from what might be expected:
 - Most common path at this level represents transfers between <u>different</u> Regions

STUDY AREA


• KEY FINDINGS:

- Overall, more transcripts are being transferred to support applications to Central Region Colleges in ARTS, and BUSINESS, and HEALTH (in that order).
- ARTS is the primary destination across most Regions and Colleges/Universities:
 - Northern and Western Colleges are the exception, where HEALTH is the primary destination








2016 - STUDY AREA

DESTINATION CREDENTIAL


Analysis only applies to Colleges

- There are some differences by path






2015 - DESTINATION CREDENTIAL

 - Some differences between First Generation and All Applicants
 - Indigenous population is in flux





DISCUSSION

• Phase 2 – More in depth

- Understand applicant behavior
 - Do some transfer paths typically see more transcripts supporting the requests?
 - How far, geographically, do applicants travel? How does it vary by program?
 - Program to program level analysis
- Understanding applicant demographics behavioural impacts
- Understand unique applicants
